Huntingdon Valley, PA - The 9th edition of the Jon M. Pritsch Cup took place on Friday, August 21, 2015 at Huntingdon Valley Country Club. Ryder Cup style matches are played between twelve junior golfers from the Philadelphia Section PGA and twelve junior golfers from the New Jersey Section PGA. These twenty four players earned their spot by placing themselves at the top of the Player of the Year points race in each section's Junior Tour. Once each player solidified their position with their respective section's roster, juniors play a singles and a four-ball match simultaneously, each worth 1 point, to gain the most points out of the 18 possible points to be earned.

The juniors from the Philadelphia Section PGA were fortunate enough to win their first Jon M. Pritsch Cup. Since New Jersey came in as the defending champions, they needed to earn 9 points on their afternoon to retain the Pritsch Cup while Philadelphia needed 9 ½ points. Early on, matches were back and forth, with Philadelphia going up in most matches out of the gate. Once all matches were completed, Philadelphia won with a total of 11 points to New Jersey's 7, despite New Jersey making comebacks on the back 9. New Jersey leads the overall matches in the Jon M. Pritsch Cup 8-1.

The New Jersey Section PGA and the Philadelphia Section PGA alternate hosting the Jon M. Pritsch Cup year to year. In 2016, the New Jersey Section PGA will host the event at a venue and date to be determined with the hopes of bringing back the Pritsch Cup.

The Jon M. Pritsch Cup is played to honor the memory of Jon M. Pritsch who tragically passed away due to heart disease in May of 1991 at the age of 17. Before his passing, Pritsch was recognized as high as 8th in the country of junior golfers. It was Jon's dream to play professional golf, so Mr. and Mrs. Pritsch developed this fund to keep his dream alive. To date the Jon M. Pritsch Memorial Fund has given over \$140,000 in scholarships to juniors looking to pursue a career in a golf related field. Scholarship applications are sent out every year to all players in the Jon M. Pritsch Cup.
